<u>Protest against offshore drilling:</u> Brown Girl Surf was a featured guest at the Rally Against Offshore Drilling in Sacramento on Feb. 8. Equity in Coastal Access panel: Brown Girl Surf was part of a panel at the 13th Annual Green California Summit, which brings together leaders in the environmental community, legislative leaders, and allies in Sacramento on Feb. 28. We presented a workshop on intangible barriers to California's Coast, including physical, cultural, and political roadblocks that prevent Californians from getting to the ocean. Fellow panel members included our friends at the City Surf Project, Wahine Project, Institute for Women Surfers, and Surfrider Foundation. Based on these discussions, we formed a coalition of organizations and agencies who want increased equity in coastal access. We are actively working on this issue in 2018 – stay tuned!


Ocean Safety Training: Last Saturday, we held our annual Ocean Safety Training. Ocean Rescue Supervisor Doug Armstrong of the National Park Service runs this training for Brown Girl Surf each spring. We were blessed with great weather and ocean conditions this year. We learned beach hazards and got to practice rescue techniques in the water! Thank you Doug!!



Since last fall, our Rising Leaders have also held several independent buddy outings, including surfing trips to Santa Cruz and Pacifica, and outings to the Oakland Museum of California.

Media coverage and development

In addition to the <u>media coverage</u> on the Rally Against Offshore Drilling, we received awesome media coverage since last fall. Mira and Brown Girl Surf won the <u>ESPN W / Toyota Everyday Heroes Award</u>. We were featured in the <u>Fader Magazine</u>, <u>Redbull Amaphiko</u>, and <u>SF Magazine</u>.
